Village Welcomes Residents

It was cold on February 19th, but there was plenty of warmth and happiness to go around inside the "D'Adamo House," a new six person cottage home for adult residents in St. Louis Guanella Village at St. Louis Center.

This new home, named for late benefactors Jerry and Alice D'Adamo, was formally

blessed by the Servants of Charity priests to prepare for its occupancy during the second week of March. The young men who are now residents of these homes participated in the event.

During the opening prayer, Fr. Satheesh Alphonse, the Community Superior, prayed that the Lord

would "enter this home and bless it with His presence," and then advised the residents present to "Seek to make your new home before all else, a dwelling place of love, diffusing far and wide the goodness of Christ."

The Servants of Charity priests who were present with the new residents included Fr.

> Satheesh, Fr. Enzo Addari, Fr. Joseph Rinaldo, Fr. David Stawasz, Fr. Franklin Arokiadoss, Fr. Amalornathan and Fr. Leo Joseph Xavier.

Following the opening prayer, Fr. Satheesh blessed the new home throughout with holy water, and the residents and staff walked through the house to check out their new rooms and other great amenities

they observed for the first time. Watching the residents, Fr. Enzo Addari, CEO of St. Louis Center, remarked that, "They too were created in the image and likeness of God, and deserve to live in a great place like this."

May the joy of the Easter season be upon all of you!

I am very grateful to all of you for showing your love to St. Louis Center and its residents.

There are many reasons for this.

The Knights of Columbus State
Council has been very generous with
us giving SLC a matching fund for \$100,000 and all of
you, combined, have met the challenge by March 31,
2021.

An anonymous donor is challenging us with a \$250K match, which will go until July 31, 2021. All the money is needed to cover the additional costs due to the COVID-19 hazard pay. We know that it will take a long time before we will be out of the pandemic.

All the residents, 16 years old and up, have been vaccinated. In the middle of January, we experienced adults testing positive to the virus, but we got everything on time and with the due precautions everyone is doing well. We still continue the weekly COVID-19 testing and daily temperature checks for residents, staff and occasional visitors.

All the adults went back to their job assignments. One of them was moved from a PT job to a full time job at the local Big Boy Restaurant. He catches the bus daily to and from the job site.

In the middle of March, the residents from KofC Hall were moved to the new houses (Neuman Home and D'Adamo Home). Thanks to all the benefactors who believed in our vision and supported it. The St. Louis Guanella Village has become a reality. This too is a monument to God's love for his precious people.

We are working on remodeling the original kitchen. The food preparation has many needs. The remodeling will allow us to meet those needs.

At the beginning of February, the Social Services department was relocated into the new suite in the main building. For this, too, I thank all of you for helping SLC to move to a new level of care.

Then, even with the challenges the pandemic is bringing, we still have many good things happening to be grateful for and giving thanks to God for them.

Social Services gets a New Home

As St. Louis Center grew over the past 10 years, so did the need for additional Social Services for this unique population. Office space was at a premium, so once the first Village Homes were completed in June 2018, Martin Hall, (in the original part of the building), was emptied of the young residents who moved into St. Louis Guanella Village.

Working with Fr. Enzo and staff, architects created a design to



locate all social work offices together for the first time.
According to Social Work Supervisor, Sheryl Mohr, this was a great improvement for her team, which works closely

together to coordinate care and support for residents.

The new space includes visitation rooms, which provide a comfortable space for parents to interact with their children. The conference room, which is wired with the latest video conferencing technology, also provides a much-needed resource for social work staff. They are now able to hold video calls and remotely connect with families, as well as care teams who are involved in managing the care of residents. After a year of work, the new Social Services Suite was opened during the first week of February with a special blessing conducted by the Servants of Charity.

According to Chief Operations Officer Deana Fisher, these upgrades are extremely important in meeting professional standards. "Our new conference room also has advanced technology to allow us to have zoom meetings with others as a group. We've definitely improved our way of doing business."

SLC Says Goodbye

One of St. Louis Center's long time employees, Social Services Specialist Linda Callendar, retired on March 12, 2021. Fellow employees attended a reception to wish Linda well that day. She reminisced with everyone about the 13 years she spent at the Center and all of



the wonderful residents that she had the pleasure of working with. Linda was primarily responsible for working with the residents at St. Joseph Hall, and according to coworker Karin Brandt, "we miss her already." We thank Linda for her many years of service to St. Louis Center.

Residents Move to the Village

Residents were able to move into the two new Cottage Homes in St. Louis Guanella Village during the week of March 15th. The residents who had been living in Knights of Columbus Hall were prepared for the move, and according to Fr. Enzo. "They were delighted with their new homes. The new bedrooms and the homelike space seemed to be much more relaxing for them, and there were huge smiles on their faces."

Deana Fisher, COO of St. Louis Center added, "The residents were really excited to have their own bathrooms and loved their new furniture and bedding. The new atmosphere was very inviting for them and they seem to love it. The next step for us will be to renovate the former K of C Hall for future use. We will be meeting with our architect soon to begin drawing up plans so that most SLC residents will be able to have their own rooms."

Generous donors contributed much of the bedding, linens, kitchen supplies and artwork adorning the walls, helping make these new houses a comfortable and welcoming home for the young men who live there.

Independent Living Options

Three new homes are available for lease in the growing St. Louis Guanella Village. Each has an open floor plan, 2 bedrooms, 2 bathrooms, daylight interiors, stainless steel appliances, granite countertops and many design features, including a main level laundry, for those wanting to age in place. Two different floor plans offer 1,015 and 1,590 sq. ft. options, each with a one car garage.

Enjoy living at St. Louis Center in this intentional, faith-based community and relaxing on your own covered front porch or cooking out on your back patio. One convenient monthly payment includes all utilities, maintenance, internet access and even weekly housekeeping. Access to campus amenities include walking trails, a special needs playground, gymnasium and chapel.


100 Women Who Care


